Gentlemen:

in accordance with the provisions of Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California, I herewith submit the 1966 Agricultural Crop Report for the County of Lassen.

The total gross production value, including livestock, is \$9,512,350. This represents an increase over the previous year of \$152,512. While this increase is relatively small, I feel it is significant in view of the fact the lack of rainfall lowered the yield of field crops considerably and despite increased prices, their total production value is down \$329,400.

Livestock and poultry production, the major source of agricultural income in this county, increased \$345,334. This alone more than offset the total value loss of field crops. Because livestock production is such an important part of our economy, inventory figures have been included in this report.

The slight increase in the total value of livestock and poultry products was contributed to largely by an increase in market milk production.

A 52 percent reduction in honey production is responsible for the loss in total value of apiary products. This too is a result of inadequate moisture during the growing season.

The total value of seed, vegetable and nursery crops increased \$114,000. This was a result of increased potato acreage and production. As predicated in 1965, the garlic seed production has declined drastically and is now included in miscellaneous crops.

Again I wish to emphasize, the gross value figures in this report do not represent farm income, as production costs are not considered.

My sincere thanks is extended to the many agencies and individuals for their fine cooperation in making available the necessary data from which this report is compiled.
