Section 65.5 of the California Agricultural Code requires that the Agricultural Commissioner compile a report covering conditions, acreage, production and value of the Avricultural products of his county.

This eighth annual crop report consists of gross prices received by the farmers for their commodities. In most cases the production is the same as last year but the increase in price shows a substantial climb over last year.

Severe frost damage was caused to fruit and berry crops. Less acreage was planted in polatices than last year. Lumber production remained about the same but the price increased the total value about two million deliars over last year.
